

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COURSE OVERVIEW

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Very little is taught on the TMJ in the physiotherapy undergraduate programs around China. The role of physiotherapy in the management of TMJ conditions is being acknowledged in this rapidly growing field of musculoskeletal physiotherapy and there has been a lot of demand for continuing educations courses to upskill our clinicians.

Our honored to invite Dr. Guy Zito who is an APA musculoskeletal and sports physiotherapist and a senior fellow of the University of Melbourne who has worked in both education and clinical practice for over 35 years to do a 2-day seminars conducted and workshop embedded in a scientific context and supported by current evidence-based practice and research.

Professional therapists can today receive this recognized certifications by Dr. Guy Zito with the clinic in Shanghai. This certification will appeal to professionals wanting to expand their treatment techniques and students developing their expertise in the diagnosis, assessment and treatment of temporomandibular conditions.

Physiotherapists are in the ideal position to make a significant contribution to the management of TMJ dysfunction. With training in that specialty area they would be better equipped to meet the ever-increasing demands placed on them by the healthcare community and consequently could realize their potential to become leaders in that field.

- 4. understand the role of physiotherapy in the treatment of TMD and the evidence that supports it
- 5. learn how to perform a comprehensive and integrated assessment of the TMJ and related structures
- 6. acquire evidence-based knowledge and expertise in the application of therapeutic skills and exercise prescription in the management of TMD
- 7. enhance their knowledge of pain mechanisms and psychosocial factors as they relate to TMD patients
- 8. become familiar with the scientific evidence that supports conservative and surgical management of TMD
- 9. gain an appreciation of the wholistic approach to TMD management and the role of other health care professionals involved in patient care

FACULTY



DR. GUY ZITO

Dr. Guy Zito is an APA musculoskeletal and sports physiotherapist and a senior fellow of the University of Melbourne who has worked in both education and clinical practice for over 35 years.

During that time he has taught on and coordinated the Master of Physiotherapy by coursework program and has helped establish other post-graduate programs in Physiotherapy. He has also been involved in mentoring and examining physiotherapists undertaking the specialization examinations through the College of Physiotherapists in Australia. In 2015 he received the APA Victorian Achievement award for his contribution to the advancement of the Physiotherapy profession.

Guy holds a Doctor of Clinical Physiotherapy degree from the University of Melbourne along with other research and coursework qualifications. His research interests have yielded a number of publications dealing with cervicogenic headache, temporomandibular joint dysfunction and differential diagnosis of headaches. He received an award for the article 'Clinical tests of musculoskeletal dysfunction in the diagnosis of cervicogenic headache' as it was one of the top 10 cited articles published in Manual Therapy.

He is the principal physiotherapist at Carlton Physiotherapy Centre in North Carlton where he treats patients with musculoskeletal conditions, including those suffering from TMJ dysfunction and headache as well as neck and back pain.

Though he is no longer involved with the University on a formal basis, he continues to pursue his passion for teaching physiotherapists and conducts short courses on a number of musculoskeletal related topics, in particular on the temporomandibular joint, within Australia and overseas.
